- ◇ **The amazing, brand new Palmach Museum** in Tel Aviv, which makes the War of Independence a reality for the visitor!
- ◇ **For a few hours we become archeologists** as we join the dig at Beit Guvrin, where every day, ongoing excavations – led by former TBA Hebrew school teacher Ian Stern!—unearth new information about Israel's—and our own - ancient past. Thousands of ancient caves date back to the time of the Phoenicians.
- ◇ **Give and take discussions with** some of the best informed, most entertaining, and most provocative political, religious and social thinkers in Israel today.
- ◇ **Standing atop the highest point in the Galilee**, overlooking the northern part of the country, we will explore the Golan Heights by jeep, understanding this strategically important part of Israel which is also one of its most breathtakingly beautiful. (Rappelling for the adventuresome among us!)

- ◇ **We will climb Masada**—some by cable car, the more intrepid, perhaps, on the snake path!—as we recreate the experience of that brave band who fought the battle of ultimate honor some 2100 years ago.
- ◇ **In the shadow of hills** from the beginning of time, a swim in the Dead Sea will refresh us—in December, even the lowest point on earth can be chilly! However, the amazing salt water spas provide one of the most luxurious experiences imaginable.
- ◇ **Visits to a Druze village and dinner in a Bedouin tent** will teach us about the diversity of Israeli society, while enabling us to appreciate the broad range of cuisine available in the country.
- ◇ **We see the Old City** from many perspectives—through archeological caves that show us the ancient city, through labyrinthine byways that demonstrate how, yet today, it is a place of many peoples, and through a historian's lens, so we may genuinely see the grandeur that once was.
- ◇ **A stroll down Rehov Dizengoff** (*dizengoffen*, in Hebrew) will enable us to walk one of Israel's most important streets, where the life of the modern Israel can most easily be experienced
