### Trip Highlights (just a taste!)

#### We will visit...

- ◇ **Dizengoff House**, Israel's "Independence Hall," where the State of Israel was formally declared into being in 1948.
- ◇ **The Palmach Museum**, where in eerily realistic sight and sound we will live the experiences of the young soldiers who fought in the War of Independence.
- ◇ **Givat HaKibbutzim**, where a secret underground factory made bullets literally under the nose of the Arabs and the British.
- ◇ **Caesarea by the Sea**, where in just the last few years archeologists have made some of the most exciting and important discoveries ever, including a Hippodrome similar to the one in which Ben Hur drove his chariot.
- ◇ **Misgav Am**, a kibbutz atop the Hula Valley, with Lebanon next door, and across the way, the Golan Heights, where jeep rides will make it clear the strategic importance of this famous piece of land.

- ◇ **Yad V'shem**, recently renovated, surely the most informative, the most thought provoking and the most moving Holocaust memorial in the world.
- ◇ **The Knesset and the Supreme Court**, two of the country's most beautiful, most significant, and most important buildings.
- ◇ **Masada**, where two millennia ago a thousand of our ancestors committed one of Jewish history's most extraordinary actions, then down 1,200 feet to the Dead Sea, to swim in the salt and be reminded of the numerous Biblical scenes that played out along its shores.
- ◇ **Jerusalem Old and New, City of David**, filled with our most sacred places, our most sacred history, the collective memories that most tie us together as Jews.

#### We will meet...

- ◇ **Jewish and Arab teens** who study in one of Israel's most academically prestigious high schools.
- ◇ **Journalists and government officials** who will teach us about the ever changing reality of Israel today.
- ◇ **Soldiers on active duty**, who will share what it is like to be a *hayil* in the Israel Defense Forces.
- ◇ **Recent American immigrants** who will recount what led them to make aliyah, no doubt provoking our thoughts about what it means to be a Jew in both Israel and the Diaspora, as well as Ethiopian and Russian immigrants who will make it clear how lucky they feel to be in our historic homeland.
